

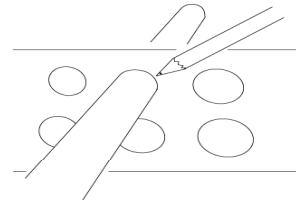
# ART CLAY<sup>TM</sup> SILVER




## Instruction for using "RING SIZE SCALE"

◆ This measurement should be used only for making a ring with *ART CLAY SILVER*. ◆

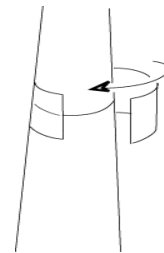
*ART CLAY SILVER* contracts about 10% in length when fired. The contraction rate depends on the shape and volume of the ring. Prepare the foundation for the ring 3 - 5 Japanese sizes or 1.5 - 2.5 American sizes larger. (Japanese size correspond to about 1/2 size in western measurements.)

- ① Measure your finger size by using the **RING SIZE SCALE**.
- ② Adding the applicable size for a type of the ring shape, insert a wooden mandrel into the added size. Mark a line with a pencil as shown.



- A**  When the band is 3 mm thick, make the ring 2 - 3 sizes (1-1.5 American sizes) larger than desired.
- B**  When the band is flat and wide (1.5mm thick/10mm wide), make the ring 3 - 4 sizes (1.5 - 2 American sizes) larger than desired.
- C**  When the band is greater in thickness and width than the rings mentioned in **A** and **B**, make the ring 4 - 5 sizes (2 - 2.5 American sizes) larger than desired.

- ③ Stick the center of a self-adhesive memo around the drawing line marked in step ②. (Regular cut paper can be substituted.)



- ④ Stick the clay around the center of the self-adhesive memo.

\*The **RING SIZE SCALE** is paper made, and the holes may become larger from repeated use. Please DO NOT damage the surface of the wooden mandrel too much. It can cause failure to correctly size.
